## Maldives' two main opp parties 'concerned' about its govt's 'anti-India stance'

CALLING INDIA as the "most long-standing ally," the two main opposition parties in Maldives on Wednesday expressed concern about the government's "anti-India stance."

The open support by the two parties — Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP), and Democrats — came a day after the Maldives government said a Chinese ship, equipped to carry research and surveys, will be docking at a Maldivian port after being permitted by the Male government to make a port call for replenishment. The permission to allow the Chinese ship comes amid strained ties between India and Maldives after its recently-elected President Mohamed Muizzu made Beijing as his first port of call early this month soon after assuming office.

Traditionally, New Delhi has

been the first port of call for a Maldivian President. "The current administration appears to be making a stark pivot towards an anti-India stance. Both, the MDP and The Democrats believe alienating any development partner, and especially the country's most long-standing ally will be extremely detrimental to the long-term development of the country," said the two opposition parties on "the direction in foreign policy" of the government.

"Stability and security in the Indian Ocean is vital to the stability and security of the Maldives," they said during a joint news conference. MDP chief and former minister Fayyaz Ismail, and Deputy Speaker of Parliament MP Ahmed Saleem with Democrats party chief MP Hassan Lathief and Parliamentary Group Leader MP Ali Azim addressed the media to flag the issues. The MPs of the two parties together hold 55 seats in the 87-member house.

## Political parties should inspire, not divide: CEC

New Delhi: Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar on Wednesday appealed to political parties, "pivot of the country's vibrant democracy," to inspire rather than promote division and personal attacks.

In his recorded address on the eve of National Voters' Day, which falls on January 25, the CEC said, "Political parties are the pivot of our democracy... Going into the 2024 general polls, we appeal to

all political parties for their continued support, while assuring them of our fullest cooperation in providing a level-playing field... It is imperative that political parties engage in discussions that inspire rather than divide, that promote ideas instead of personal attacks."

"In 2024, we will have the world's largest peacetime movement... to enable 95 crore voters to exercise their franchise...", according to CEC Kumar. ENS

## DGCA ends CFOI contract: Sources

Aviation safety regulator DGCA on Wednesday terminated the contract of its Chief Flight Operations Inspector (CFOI), according to sources. There was no immediate comment from the DGCA on the decision. The official, who was earlier serv-

ing as a wide-body pilot with Air India, joined the regulator as CFOI on an ad hoc basis in March 2021.

An order issued by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation said the services of the official have been terminated with immediate effect on administrative grounds and in the public interest, sources in the know said.

## Senior advocates engage in verbal duel in SC over Adani Power's petition

THE SUPREME COURT on Wednesday witnessed a heated exchange of words between senior advocates A M Singhvi and Dushyant Dave with the former defending an application filed by Adani Power in a matter concerning late payment of surcharge, and Dave appearing for Jaipur Vidyut Vitran Nigam Limited accusing Singhvi's client of abusing the process of court.

The dispute was regarding the maintainability of a miscellaneous application filed by Adani Power with Dave contending that it could not have been filed as the court had already passed a final judgment in the matter.

Singhvi told the bench of Justice Aniruddha Bose and Justice P V Sanjay Kumar that the applications were filed in terms of two earlier orders of the SC allowing it to approach the "appropriate forum" for payment of the surcharge. As Dave remarked that the application was an abuse of the process of the court, Singhvi took objection and said "the use of adjectives like abuse itself is an abuse of the process of the court".

Stating that he would address the court on the point of maintainability of the application, Singhvi said he had approached the SC believing it was the "appropriate forum", adding that he was ready to withdraw the plea and approach the "appropriate forum".

"Let us not deal with such matters by innuendo and insinuation. Let us deal with it in a reasonable, practicable manner... I have been prosecuting these applications because we bonafide believe that these orders entitle us to", said Singhvi. Dave opposed the request for withdrawal and said it should not be granted in "larger public interest" as "Rs 1,400 crore is sought to be extracted from the state".

Singhvi said Dave was getting into the merits of the matter which he (Singhvi) did not. "Don't tell me what I should argue", Dave shot back.

Dave said that the prayer raised in the application had already been dealt with by the court in the judgment and the petitioners had not filed a review petition against it.

As the matter proceeded, Dave told Singhvi, "You wanted to grab an order from this court. That's why you tried to short-cut it".

# Modi, Macron at Jaipur Shobha Yatra today

AS FRENCH President Emmanuel Macron lands in Jaipur Thursday afternoon, India is rolling out the red carpet with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in his signature style, joining him at a roadshow called the Shobha Yatra.

During the Shobha Yatra, Macron and Modi will travel from Jantar Mantar to Hawa Mahal 6 pm onward, covering a kilometre in the Pink City.

This roadshow will be similar to the one Prime Minister Modi had hosted for Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe in September 2017 in an open-top vehicle in Ahmedabad. In February 2020, also in Ahmedabad, heled a red-carpet welcome for US President Donald Trump who was greeted by people of the city.

"This is one of the unique formats, where a visiting foreign leader is given a royal style welcome involving people of the country," a senior official, in charge of the arrangements, said.

Modi and Macron will meet for dinner at Jaipur's Taj Rambagh Palace, where they will hold a conversation on bilateral and global issues of concern and interest.

Macron, who will be the Chief Guest at the Republic Day celebrations in New Delhi on January 26, will begin his Jaipur trip by visiting Amer Fort, Jantar Mantar and Hawa Mahal on Thursday. He will be the sixth leader from France to be the chief guest at the Republic Day celebrations.

Sources said Macron's visit is a unique reciprocal gesture involving visits by Heads of States on successive national days — the PM visited France on its National Day on July 13-14, 2023.

While this visit caps the 25th anniversary celebrations of the Strategic Partnership between the two countries, the two leaders have met half a dozen times in 2023 alone, including on the sidelines of the G20 Summit in New Delhi last September.

"With France, we have a special relationship. Firstly, the visit caps a milestone year of the 25th anniversary of our strate-

gic partnership. India-France Strategic Partnership, the first that India signed with any Western country, has seen all round progress — in bilateral, regional and international context. India and France have traditionally enjoyed close and friendly relations and share a deep and enduring Strategic Partnership covering all aspects of bilateral cooperation which involves a strategic component," an official said.

Launched on January 26, 1998, the Strategic Partnership that was the first-ever for India among the Western countries and a first for France outside the EU, embodies the core vision of both countries to develop their respective strategic independ-

strong Indo-Pacific component. Modi and Macron are also expected to deliberate on expanding maritime cooperation in the Indo-Pacific, the situation in the Red Sea, the Hamas-Israel conflict and the war in Ukraine.

On Friday, at the Republic Day parade where Macron will be chief guest, a 95-member marching contingent and 33-member band contingent from France will take part in the parade. Two Rafale fighter jets and an Airbus A330 multi-role tanker transport aircraft of the French Air Force will also feature in the parade. The French marching contingent from the French Foreign Legion features six Indians.

Macron will attend the 'At Home' reception by President Droupadi Murmu at Rashttrapi Bhavan. He is scheduled to hold a meeting with Murmu at 7.10 pm, and depart Delhi at 10.05 pm.

## Centre nod Karnataka HC chief justice's elevation to SC

THE CENTRE on Wednesday cleared the appointment of Karnataka High Court Chief Justice PB Varale as a judge of the Supreme Court. The appointment comes less than a week after the Supreme Court Collegium had recommended his name.

"In exercise of the powers conferred by the Constitution of India, Hon'ble President, after consultation with Hon'ble Chief Justice of India, is pleased to appoint Sh Justice Prasanna Bhalachandra Varale, Chief Justice of the Karnataka High Court as judge of Supreme Court of India," Union Law Minister Meghwal tweeted on Wednesday. With this appointment, the SC will once again function at full-strength.

The lone vacancy was created when Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul retired in December last year.

"The SC has operated almost throughout last year with full strength of 34 judges and, therefore, could achieve the distinction of recording an unprecedented rate of disposal by disposing of 52,191 cases in the calendar year 2023," the resolution had stated.
